REPUBLIC ACT No. 7832

Anti-Pilferage of Electricity and Theft of Electric Transmission Lines/Materials Act of 1994

ILLEGAL USE OF ELECTRICITY

UNAUTHORIZED TAP, make or cause to be made any connection with overhead lines, service drops, or other electric service wires.

TAMPER, install or use a tampered electricity meter, jumper, current

reversing transformer, shorting or shunting wire, loop connection or any other device which interferes with the proper or accurate registry or metering of electric current or otherwise results in its diversion in a manner whereby electricity is stolen or wasted.





DAMAGE or DESTROY an electricity meter, equipment, wire or conduit or allow any of them to be so damaged or destroyed as to interfere with the proper or accurate metering of electric current.

TILTED METER

UNAUTHORIZED TAP, make or cause to be made any connection to the existing electric service facilities of any duly registered consumer... considered as "FLYING CONNECTION".



Resolution No. 06, Series of 2011 entitled "A Resolution Adopting the Amendments to the Rules and Regulations Implementing Republic Act No. 7832"

"Section 11. No customer shall be allowed to provide electricity to premises other than those covered under the customer's service contract with the DU. Subject to a notice, this may be a ground for disconnection of electric service. The customer may also be assessed a surcharge for such violation."

"Article 2.30.1.2. Number of Services. A building or other structure served shall be **SUPPLIED BY ONLY ONE SERVICE** xxx.

PENALTIES

Imprisonment from 6 years and 1 day to 20 years or a fine ranging from P10,000 to P20,000 or both, at the discretion of the court.
